Privately explore the universe with your group at the state's largest - and one of the most technologically advanced - planetariums in the Midwest! *Wisconsin Skies*, a friendly, interactive program for all ages, will now be presented on a reservation-only basis, Monday through Thursday evenings, at the Daniel M. Soref Planetarium in the Milwaukee Public Museum, 800 W. Wells St. in Milwaukee.

The first hour of *Wisconsin Skies* will be stargazing under the planetarium dome. The audience will have the opportunity to view their favorite constellation, star or planet. Visitors can also ask any question under the sun—or moon--about the vast cosmos we live in!

The second hour will shift outdoors to the real sky and showcase the Planetarium's new telescopes. Highlights for the fall viewing will be Jupiter and the Moon. If the weather does not cooperate, telescope demonstrations will be given inside in the main concourse. *Wisconsin Skies* is the perfect resource for Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts working on their Astronomy and Sky Search merit badges!
